The trustees have deliberately kept the award parameters wide to remain open to a variety of projects including some at the more innovative end of the spectrum. Firstport – Build It Awards This scheme is for individuals who have already piloted their social enterprise idea, have been trading for about 12 months and have generated income through selling a product or a service. They want to see that you have a business track record and that your idea has generated a positive impact in your community of need. Funding is available to cover an individual's salary/living costs for one year, so that they can begin running the business full time. Shortlisted applicants will be required to attend in person to pitch to our panel on 21 March 2019. Sportscotland – Sport Facilities Fund This scheme supports capital projects that create or improve places that people take part in sport and physical activity. Awards of up to £100,000 are available for sports facility projects within club & communities, school & education or performance sport environments. In clubs and communities they will support: • new, upgraded or extended sports facilities; • Inclusive changing facilities; • facilities that provide or improve access for outdoor sport and adventure activities; • floodlights that increase capacity at appropriate sports facilities; and • major items of sports equipment. They will provide enhanced support to projects within or serving the most deprived communities, according to the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD). They operate only two investment rounds each year. Small projects have a deadline of 1 April and 1 September for a decision within three months of the deadline. Stage 1 large projects should be submitted by the 1st of any month and stage 2 by 1 April and 1 September for a decision within three months of the deadline. Log on to the

Sportscotland website and follow the online wizard to guide you through creating your own 'MySport' account and completing the application form. You can apply for up to 50% of project costs. There is a single stage process for projects costing up to £250,000. Zero Waste Scotland – Resource Efficiency Waste Prevention Implementation Fund (WPIF) This scheme has been designed to help organisations overcome barriers to undertake a particular project with a focus on raw materials savings, carbon savings and the movement of waste material up the waste hierarchy. Its core purpose is to support the physical implementation of waste prevention measures in the food and drink, construction and other (commercial and industrial) sectors. Projects should: 1. generate efficiencies in the use of raw materials; 2. move waste materials to a higher level in the waste hierarchy; 3. reduce waste tonnage; 4. divert waste from landfill; generate carbon savings. The first stage in the WPIF application process involves submitting an online Expression of Interest. Henry Smith Charity – Strengthening Communities This scheme is designed to support small charitable organisations working at grassroots level in the most disadvantaged areas of the UK (10% most deprived), targeting places that are economically marginalised and affected by poverty. They will fund work that enables: people from across the community to participate in activities which improve connectedness, opportunities and wellbeing; people who are excluded, vulnerable or facing other forms of hardship to have access to community-based services that support positive lasting change; a stronger, active, more engaged community. There are no deadlines, the trust assess applications as they are received and will provide funding ranging from £20,000 to £60,000. It will take up to six months from submission for you to hear the outcome, though you will know within eight weeks if your application is not being shortlisted. Henry Smith Charity - Improving Lives This scheme provides grants to charitable organisations that help people when other sources of support have failed, are inappropriate, or are simply not available. They support established organisations delivering services directly to beneficiaries. The six priority areas are: 1. Help at a Critical Moment - Helping people to rebuild their lives following a crisis, critical moment, trauma or abuse; 2. Positive Choices - Helping people, whose actions or behaviours have led to negative consequences for themselves and others; 3. Accommodation / Housing Support - Enabling people to work towards or maintain accommodation; 4. Employment and Training - Supporting people to move towards or gain employment; 5. Financial Inclusion, Rights & Entitlements - Supporting people to overcome their financial problems and ensure that they are able to claim their rights and entitlements; and 6. Support Networks & Family - Working with people to develop improved support networks and family relationships.
